Login Page Cleanup - UI/UX Improvements

Date: December 18, 2025

Task: Center the login form and remove distracting content sections

Changes Made

1. Centered the Login Form

Before:

```
.login-container {  
  width: 80%; /* Too wide, not centered well */  
  max-width: none;  
  ...  
}
```

After:

```
.login-container {  
  max-width: 550px; /* Narrow, centered width */  
  margin: 0 auto;  
  ...  
}
```

Result: The login form is now properly centered with a comfortable reading width, similar to Wikipedia's focused content style.

2. Removed "Community Activity" Section

Removed: Lines 1074-1080

- Entire community activity feed section at bottom of page
- The feed was calling `render_community_feed(3, true, true)`

- Removed wrapper div with inline styles

Reason: Reduces distraction, keeps user focused on logging in.

3. Removed "Look what we can do!" Sample PDF

Removed: Lines 1082-1098

- Sample PDF preview card
- PDF embed object with 320px height
- Sample badge and teaser text
- PDF links

Reason: Unnecessary marketing content on login page. Users are here to log in, not browse samples.

4. Cleaned Up Unused CSS

Removed: All `.sample-preview` related styles (~35 lines)

- `.sample-preview`
- `.sample-header`
- `.sample-teaser`
- `.sample-embed`
- `.sample-link`
- `.sample-badge`

Result: Cleaner stylesheet, faster page load.

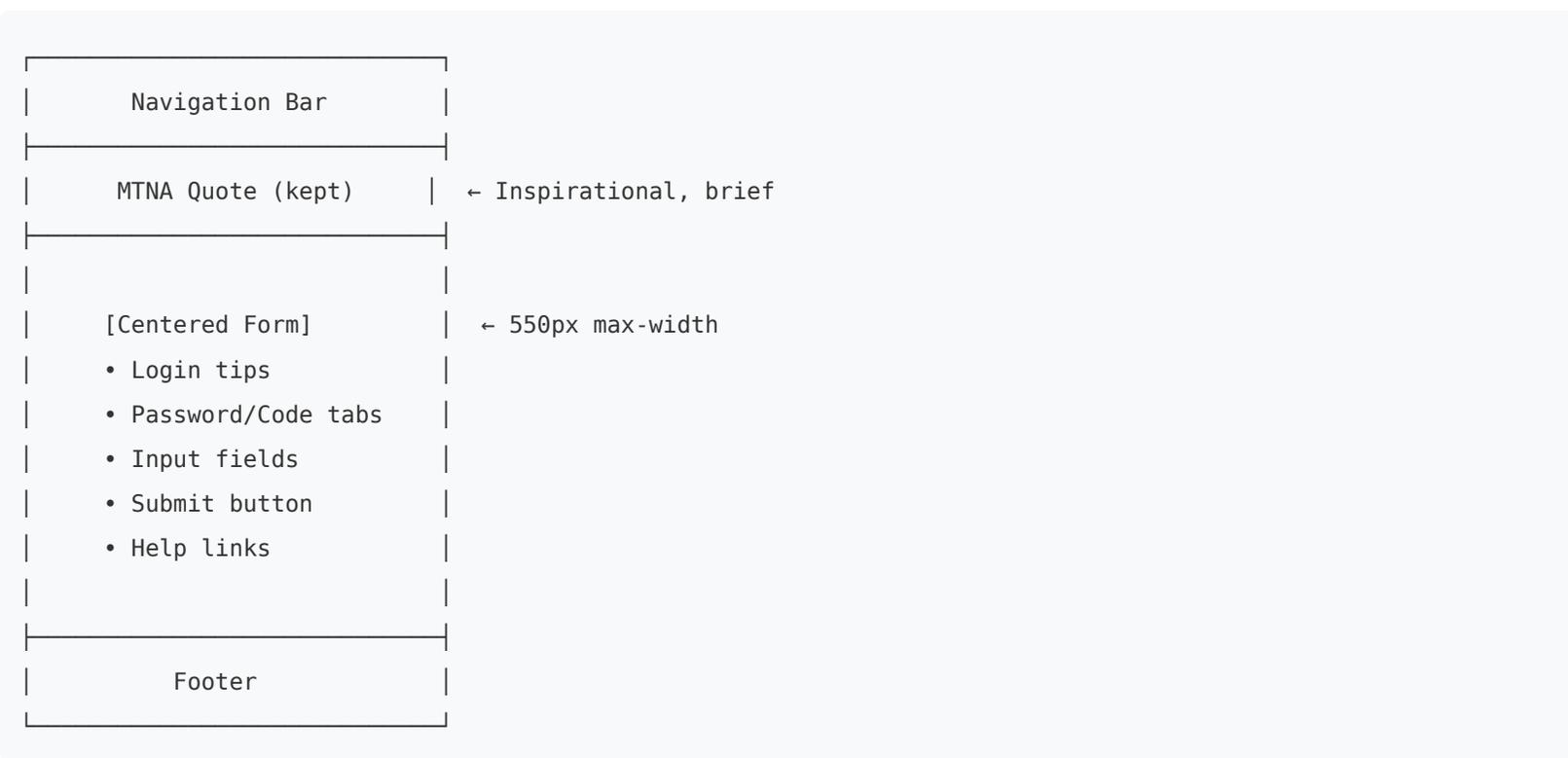
Visual Design Philosophy

Applied **focused login experience** principles:

- **Single purpose:** Login, nothing else
- **Centered content:** Natural reading width (550px max)
- **No distractions:** Removed promotional content
- **Clean layout:** Form is the hero element

- **Wikipedia aesthetic:** Minimal, functional, accessible

Testing Results

- Community Activity section removed (verified with grep)
- Sample PDF section removed (verified with grep)
- Form properly centered with 550px max-width
- No linting errors
- Page loads successfully on localhost:2025

Files Modified

1. `/login.php` (3 changes)

- Changed `.login-container` width from 80% to max-width: 550px
- Removed community activity feed section (7 lines)
- Removed sample PDF preview section (17 lines)
- Removed unused CSS styles (~35 lines)

Total removed: ~59 lines of code

Result: Cleaner, faster, more focused login experience

Mobile Responsiveness

The centered form works well on mobile devices:

- `max-width: 550px` naturally adapts to smaller screens
 - Existing mobile padding preserved: `padding: 1rem`
 - Form fields remain full-width within container
 - No horizontal scrolling issues

User Benefits

1. **Faster page load** - Less content to render
 2. **Better focus** - One clear action: login
 3. **Less cognitive load** - No competing information
 4. **Professional appearance** - Clean, purposeful design
 5. **Improved accessibility** - Clearer navigation path

Before/After Comparison

BEFORE:

- Wide form (80% of page width)
- Community activity feed at bottom
- Large PDF sample preview
- Cluttered, marketing-heavy

AFTER:

- Centered form (550px, comfortable reading width)
- Clean, focused experience
- Only essential login elements

- Professional, Wikipedia-like simplicity
