### Session Goal

Clean up forms and pages to reduce clutter and improve user experience with Wikipedia-inspired design aesthetic.

### Contact Form (contact.php) COMPLETED

#### Completed Tasks

- [x] Identify problem: verification question looks like a button
- [x] Remove button-like styling from verification question
- [x] Change verification question to semantic `<p>` tag
- [x] Simplify all form field styling (Wikipedia borders and colors)
- [x] Update submit button design (cleaner, simpler)
- [x] Create `.readonly-field` class for logged-in users
- [x] Reduce visual clutter throughout form
- [x] Add h2 border styling
- [x] Simplify form messages (left-border design)
- [x] Test on localhost:2025
- [x] Verify no linting errors
- [x] Create documentation

**Result:** Professional, clean contact form with clear hierarchy and reduced cognitive load.

### Login Page (login.php) COMPLETED

## Completed Tasks

- [x] Center the login form (changed from 80% width to max-width: 550px)
- [x] Remove "Community Activity" feed section
- [x] Remove "Look what we can do!" sample PDF preview
- [x] Remove unused CSS styles for removed sections
- [x] Test on localhost:2025
- [x] Verify both sections are removed (grep verification)
- [x] Verify no linting errors
- [x] Create documentation

**Result:** Focused, professional login experience without distractions. Form is properly centered with comfortable reading width.

### Other Pages to Review

- [ ] `forgot_password.php` - Check if it needs similar centering/cleanup
- [ ] `subscribe.php` - Review form layout and styling consistency
- [ ] `reset_password.php` - Ensure consistent design with `login.php`
- [ ] `profile.php` or `home.php` - Review dashboard/main pages for clutter

### Form Consistency

- [ ] Audit all forms site-wide for consistent styling
- [ ] Create reusable form component styles
- [ ] Document form design patterns in style guide

## Testing & Validation

- [ ] Keyboard navigation verification
- [ ] Form submission end-to-end testing

## Design Principles Established

### Simplicity First

- Remove unnecessary visual elements
- Reduce cognitive load
- Focus on primary user action

### Wikipedia Aesthetic

- Minimal borders and shadows
- Subtle colors and typography
- Clean, sharp corners (2-3px)
- Clear hierarchy without heavy styling

### Centered Content

- Comfortable reading width (550-650px)
- Natural eye scanning pattern
- Professional appearance

### Semantic HTML

- Use appropriate tags (p, label, input)
- ARIA attributes for accessibility
- Logical document structure

## Consistent Interactions

- Standard focus states
- Clear hover effects
- Obvious clickable elements

## Metrics

**Code Removed:** ~100 lines (unused CSS, promotional content)

**Pages Improved:** 2 (contact.php, login.php)

**Load Time Impact:** Improved (less HTML/CSS to parse)

**User Experience:** Significantly cleaner and more focused

**Accessibility:** Improved with semantic HTML and better focus states
